THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IS HEADED BY AN ATTORNEY GENERAL ELECTED TO A FOUR-YEAR TERM. THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IS THE CHIEF LEGAL OFFICER OF THE COMMONWEALTH GOVERNMENT AND IS RESPONSIBLE FOR:

- PROVIDING LEGAL ADVICE TO THE GOVERNOR AND EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENTS
 INCLUDING PUBLIC CORPORATIONS AND AUTONOMOUS AGENCIES;

Our Progress

ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

- Prevailed in: Litigation cases (5); and Administrative matters (2)
- Prevailed in subsequent filing of an inverse condemnation case in an attempt to increase the value of the property by filing a new case
- Prevailed in 15 of 16 Appeals decided in FY2020
- Supported a majority of states to settle the claims against two opioid drug manufacturers, Purdue and Mallinckrodt
- Successfully defended the Commonwealth from being included as a party in the Superior Court case against the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation for deficient employer contributions to the Northern Mariana Islands Retirement Fund in accordance with the settlement reached in the District Court case
- Successfully defended the position that the CNMI Public School System is constitutionally entitled only to general revenues in In Re Matter of a Petition for Certified Question in Supreme Court No. 2018-SCC-0021-CQU
- Successfully protested the parole of a convicted murder
- Successfully handled an extradition case on behalf of the State of Nevada, seeking an arrest and return of a Chinese national for check fraud
- Filed briefs and conducted oral argument in Commonwealth v. Aldan, 2020 MP where the Court affirmed the conviction and sentence for Sexual Assault in the First Degree; thus,

ensuring the victim received justice rightly deserved

What's Next

HIGHLIGHTS:

- Provided legal guidance to newly created agencies: the Commonwealth Cannabis
 Commission and the Northern Marianas Technical Institute
- Provided legal guidance to the Commonwealth's response to the global COVID-19 pandemic on the implementation of emergency services
- Resolved fourteen (14) contested litigation and administrative matters
- Presented at a Continuing Legal Education event organized by the U.S. District Court on Challenges for the Prosecution
- Drafted and updated proposed legislation on the Commonwealth 2020 Election Laws and numerous Criminal Laws
- Improved and modernized the office's case management system to ensure accuracy and increase efficiency of the database
- Bring up to date the office's Disaster & Emergency Response Manual

CHALLENGES:

- The shortfall of revenue together with the COVID-19 pandemic resulted in severe reduction in government funding which affected the office's personnel and operational budget. Our office went through a series of reductions in the following areas:
 - A budget reduction of close to 30% affected the office's FY2020 appropriation
 - A 64-hour work schedule was implemented
 - 48% further reduction of the FY2020 budget was imposed forcing the government to implement a furlough; the OAG furloughed nine (9) Civil Service employees

KEY INITIATIVES FOR 2021:

- Continue to provide legal advice and guidance to the Executive Branch, Departments and Agencies and to represent the Commonwealth in the trial court and on matters currently on appeal
- Focus on illegal business practices that hurt our consumers and other businesses;
 implement consumer awareness programs and investigate consumer complaints
- Continue to promote and ensure an open and transparent government
- Continue to work on new procurement regulations for the government and provide training to agencies
- Continue to explore solutions to mental health issues in the criminal justice system
- Continue to collaborate with other jurisdictions to expand resource activities to combat illegal drug and criminal activity in the CNMI
