The Fifteenth Northern Marianas Commonwealth Youth Congress convened its First Day, First Regular Session on Saturday, April 18, 2015, at 10:05 a.m., in the House Chamber on Capitol Hill, Saipan, Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.

OPENING OF THE CEREMONY

Master of Ceremony: Good morning and welcome to the Legislature. I call upon the Sergeant-At-Arms to please escort the Presiding Officers of the Nineteenth Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature, House Speaker Joseph P. Deleon Guerrero and Senate President Victor B. Hocog to the platform.

INVOCATION

Master of Ceremony: Thank you, Saipan Southern High School and Ms. Royal. I ask everyone to please remain standing and I call upon the Sergeant-At-Arms to please escort Father James to the podium to offer the Invocation.

Father James: Good and gracious god, on this day we offer you our thanksgiving for the gift of our lives our families and our friends and this wonderful community gathered here in this present moment. We likewise give thanks for the young people gathered here members of the CNMI Youth Congress continue to pour out your love and blessings upon these young women and men grant them the wisdom to know and make good decisions the courage and patience to endure the hardships of life and the joy that comes from service the sharing of their gifts and talents and selfless love. Bless too their parents and all parents throughout our lands that they maybe guardians and supporters of their children making the family a sanctuary of peace, learning and life, bless our time together, O' God and keep us always in your love, we make this prayer in your name, amen.

WELCOMING REMARKS

Master of Ceremony: Thank you, Father James. Please be seated. Ladies and gentlemen it is with distinct honor that I welcome you all to this Inauguration Ceremony of the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress. To witness this monumental event, we are privileged with the presence of, The Honorable Lt. Governor Ralph DLG. Torres; the Honorable Alexandro C. Castro and our Honorable House and Senate members along with the dignitaries present with us today our friends, families and most especially the proud parents of the Youth Senators-elect, I welcome you all to the Legislative branch. On behalf of the members of the Nineteenth Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature and the staff of the Legislative Bureau, congratulations to the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress. Ladies and gentlemen, it is with great pleasure that I call upon Speaker Pro Tem, the Honorable Joseph P. Deleon Guerrero, to officially call this Organizational Session of the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress to order. Speaker Pro Tem Deleon Guerrero, please.

Speaker Pro Tem Joseph P. Deleon Guerrero: Thank you MC, and before I call this Organizational Session to order also I would like to echo the welcome from the MC, welcome our dignitaries, Lt. Governor, Chief Justice, Father James, members of both Houses, to our Senators-elect and to parents, welcome again and I am sure the Senate President joins me in welcoming all of you and with that at this time. The Organizational session of the Fifteenth Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands Youth Congress is hereby call to order. I have received the certifications of all the Senators-Elect to the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress. However, the Youth Congress shall be the judge of the selection and qualification of its own members. With the consensus of the members of the Youth Congress, I hereby appoint Senator-Elect Roselyn B. Tanghal as Floor Leader Pro Tem until the position of the Floor Leader is elected. I now ask the Clerk to call the roll, please.

ROLL CALL

The Clerk called the roll and all eight senators-elect were present.

**APPOINTMENT OF CREDENTIALS AND ADOPTION OF CREDENTIALS
COMMITTEE REPORT**

Speaker Pro Tem Joseph P. Deleon Guerrero: Thank you, Clerk. Pursuant to the roll call, all Senators-elect are present this morning a quorum is established to proceed forward with the Organizational Session of the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress. The first order of business is to appoint the Credentials Committee to review the credentials of the Youth Congress Senators-Elect. I hereby appoint **Senator-Elect Catherine C. Manglona** to Chair the Credentials Committee. To serve as members of the committee, I shall appoint **Senators-Elect, Reynafe N. Aniga, Roselyn B. Tanghal, and Thomas Lee A. Manglona II**. At this point, I declare the Youth Congress in recess until such time that the Credentials Committee is ready to report back to this body. Will take a short recess.

RECESS

The Youth Congress recessed at 10:23 a.m.

The Youth Congress reconvened at 10:25 a.m.

Speaker Pro Tem Joseph P. Deleon Guerrero: At this time this Organizational Session is call back to order. Thank you, Youth Congress. I now recognize Senator-Elect Catherine C. Manglona, Chairperson of the Credentials Committee.

Senator-Elect Catherine C. Manglona : Thank you, Mr. Speaker Pro Tem Deleon Guerrero. Your Credentials Committee begs to leave to report that upon duly reviewing the pertinent credentials of Senators-elect Catherine Cabrera Manglona, William Philip Hinson, Kayjon Bradley Torres Boadi, Henry Kyle Babauta Hofschneider, Roselyn Baluyut Tanghal, Thomas Lee Atalig Manglona II, Reynafe Naol Aniga and Gerald King Crisostomo Jr., your Credentials Committee finds that each of the aforementioned senators-elect have been duly elected and meet the requirements of Public Law 17-22 and specifically, 1CMC § 1611 of the CNMI Youth Congress Reform Act of 2010, which states that the “youth congress shall be the judge of the selection and qualification of its members.”

Speaker Pro Tem Deleon Guerrero: Thank you, Chair. May I request for a motion for the adoption of the Credentials Committee Report? I now recognize Senator-elect Catherine C. Manglona.

Senator-Elect Catherine C. Manglona: Thank you, Mr. Speaker Pro Tem. I move for the adoption of the Credentials Committee Report No. 15-01.

The motion was seconded

Speaker Pro Tem Deleon Guerrero: Thank you, a motion has been offered and has been seconded. Any discussion? A motion for the adoption of the Credentials Committee Report No. 15-01 has been made and seconded. "All in favor of the motion please say "AYE" those opposed, please say "NAY." Motion carries and Credentials Committee Report 15-01 is adopted.

SWEARING-IN OF MEMBERS

Speaker Pro Tem Deleon Guerrero: We shall continue with the Order of Business. Under item 4 of today's agenda, we are privileged and honored to have the presence of the Chief Justice of the CNMI Supreme Court, the Honorable Alexandro Castro, to administer the Oath of Office. I now ask the Senators-Elect to please rise and I ask the Sergeant-At-Arms to escort Chief Justice Castro to the podium.

Chief Justice Castro: Will the future of this Commonwealth the Fifteenth Youth Congress, please raise your right hand and repeat after me.

All Youth Senators-Elect recited the following:

"I do solemnly swear, that I will support and defend The Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, the Covenant to Establish a Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands in Political Union with the United States of America, the applicable provisions of the Constitution, laws, and treaties of the United States of America, and that I will faithfully discharge my duties as a duly elected Senator, to the fifteenth Youth Congress to the best of my ability and that I will conduct myself with dignity and civility and show respect toward my colleagues, staff and all other persons, so help me God."

Chief Justice Castro: Congratulations.

Speaker Pro Tem Deleon Guerrero: Thank you again Chief Justice. Senators please sign and hand over your forms to the Sergeant-At-Arms.

ADOPTION OF CNMI YOUTH CONGRESS RULES

Speaker Pro Tem Deleon Guerrero: Please be seated, and Congratulations one more round of applause. At this time, the Chair will entertain a motion for the adoption of the CNMI Youth Congress Rules of Procedure. I now recognize Floor Leader Pro Tem Roselyn B. Tanghal.

Floor Leader Pro Tem Roselyn B. Tanghal: Thank you, Mr. Speaker Pro Tem. I would like to introduce Youth Congress Resolution No. 15-01, "A Youth Congress Resolution to officially adopt the Rules of Procedure for the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress." At the same time, I would like to move for the adoption of the resolution.

The motion was seconded

Speaker Pro Tem Deleon Guerrero: Thank you. The Floor Leader Pro Tem has just introduced Youth Congress Resolution No. 15-01 and at the same time offered a motion for its adoption. The motion has been seconded. Is there any discussion? Thank you. All in favor of the motion to adopt Youth Congress Resolution No. 15-01, please say "AYE." Oppose, please say "NAY." Motion carries. Youth Congress Resolution No. 15-01 is hereby adopted.

ELECTION OF SPEAKER

Speaker Pro Tem Deleon Guerrero: My favorite part. We now move to the next item of the Order of Business, and that is for the Election of the Speaker. The floor is now open for nominations. I recognize Senator Crisostomo.

Senator Crisostomo: Thank you, Mr. Speaker Pro Tem; I nominate Senator Thomas Lee A. Manglona II to the Office of the Speaker for the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress.

The motion was seconded

Speaker Pro Tem Deleon Guerrero: Nomination has been made and has been seconded for Senator Thomas Lee A. Manglona II to the Office of the Speaker for the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress. Any discussion? Is there any other nomination? I recognize Senator Crisostomo.

Senator Crisostomo: Thank you, Mr. Speaker Pro Tem Deleon Guerrero. I move to close nomination.

Speaker Pro Tem Deleon Guerrero: Thank you Senator. A motion has been made to close nomination, and has been seconded, all in favor of that motion say "aye". Oppose say "nay". There is only one nomination on the floor for the Office of the Speaker. The nominee is Senator Thomas Lee A. Manglona II. There being no other nominee, Senator Thomas Lee A. Manglona II is hereby elected by acclamation to serve as the Speaker for the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress. Congratulations Senator Manglona.

I now ask the Sergeant-at-Arms to escort the newly elected Speaker to preside over this Inaugural Session.

ELECTION OF VICE-SPEAKER

YC Speaker Thomas Lee A. Manglona II: Thank you very much for your vote of confidence to serve as your Speaker for the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress. Let us move on with our Order of Business. The Floor is now open for the nomination for the Office of the Vice Speaker. Senator Aniga, you are recognized.

Senator Reynafe N. Aniga: Thank you. Mr. Speaker; I nominate Senator Roselyn B. Tanghal to the Office of the Vice Speaker for the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress.

The motion was seconded

YC Speaker Thomas Lee A. Manglona II: A motion has been made to close nomination, and has been seconded, all in favor of that motion please say “aye”. Oppose say “nay: There is only one nomination on the floor for the Office of the Vice Speaker. The nominee is Senator Roselyn B. Tanghal. There being no other nominee, Senator Tanghal is hereby elected by acclamation to serve as a Vice-Speaker for the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress. Congratulations Senator Tanghal.

ELECTION OF FLOOR LEADER

YC Speaker Thomas Lee A. Manglona II: The Floor is now open for the nomination for the Office of the Floor Leader. Senator Hinson, you are recognized.

Senator William P. Hinson: Thank you. Mr. Speaker; I nominate Senator Kayjon T. Boadi to the Office of the Floor Leader for the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress.

The motion was seconded

YC Speaker Thomas Lee A. Manglona II: There is a nomination on the floor nominating Senator Kayjon T. Boadi to the Office of the Floor Leader, and has been seconded. Is there any other nomination? Senator Hinson you are recognized.

Senator William P. Hinson: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, I move to close nomination.

The motion was seconded

YC Speaker Thomas Lee A. Manglona II: A motion has been made to close nomination, and has been seconded, all in favor of that motion please say “aye”. Oppose say “nay”. There is only one nomination on the floor for the Office of the Floor Leader. The nominee is Senator Kayjon T. Boadi. There being no other nominee, Senator Boadi is hereby elected by acclamation to serve as the Floor Leader for the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress. Congratulations Floor Leader Boadi.

ELECTION OF LEGISLATIVE SECRETARY

YC Speaker Thomas Lee A. Manglona II: We now move on to the election of Legislative Secretary. Senator Tanghal, you are recognized.

Senator Roselyn B. Tanghal: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, I nominate Senator Reynafe N. Aniga to the Office of the Legislative Secretary for the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress.

Senator Roselyn B. Tanghal: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I move to close nomination.

YC Speaker Thomas Lee A. Manglona II: A motion has been made to close nomination, and has been seconded, all in favor of that motion please say “aye”. Oppose say “nay”. There is only one nomination on the floor for the Office of the Legislative Secretary. The nominee is Senator Reynafe N. Aniga. There being no other nominee, Senator Reynafe N. Aniga is hereby elected by acclamation to serve as the Legislative Secretary for the Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress. Congratulations Senator Aniga. Fellow Senators, we have elected our leadership for this Fifteenth CNMI Youth Congress. Once again, I would like to thank each and every one of you for your confidence. I, together with the newly elected officers, look forward to serving you and our peers in the best way we can.

YC Speaker Thomas Lee A. Manglona II: Thank you, Senator Tanghal. Good morning to you all. I would like to start by first thanking all my fellow Senators for all their remarks and especially Mount Carmel School for electing me to a second term in this Youth Congress. You have placed your trust in me to serve you for 2 more years, and I am grateful for your support. I also want to thank my family Bill and Nicole, Prudencio, Uncle John and especially my dad, for trusting the airlines and making it on the ground safely. Dad, don't be surprised if you are here for a few more days. A huge thank you to my teachers who are in the audience, Youth Congress' community partner agencies, DYS and the coalition against domestic and sexual violence and really everyone in this room for coming. Your support does not go unnoticed. As you've heard from my fellow youth senators, today's youth face tremendous odds. We play a key role in solving the critical issues facing our GREATEST ASSET – our youth. I truly believe that how we reach a concrete solution to the issues teens face is threefold: it takes **child, parent, and community**. It is my mission as the Speaker to guide the youth and ensure they get more than just 25 percent. Because we all know that we just can't give 25 percent. We need to mean a 100% of every word spoken and action taken by this congress and community as a whole. We give a 100 percent with this new and fresh congress for the kid on Rota who goes to work to earn money before doing his English homework, we give 100% of ourselves for the tutor in AmeriCorps who spends her weekends and after school time instilling a love of reading and vocabulary in her students or even the mother on Tinian who comes home late after work to cook dinner for her children, worrying if she'll have enough money for the next CUC bill. We serve for the Marianas High School students, and countless others, who walked into the office of the Saipan Tribune and delivered dozens of letters to the editor DEMANDING that PSS puts students FIRST! With all of this, we are then faced with the questions: *What needs to happen? How do we make it happen?* We must look past the picturesque tourist sites, pristine beaches, and lavish casinos. The life of a girl and boy in the islands is difficult, involves struggle, and a lot of hard work. The whole purpose of Youth Congress is to create ladders of opportunity for our peers.

And that's where youth, in the solution, comes into place. But these ladders can only be placed when youth are accountable for their actions and when they do their part. Those in this room are not strangers to our youth. You are parent representatives at school, you volunteer on weekend competitions, and help children with their homework and projects. Let's continue this pattern and translate conversation into action. Because we can hold all the luncheons, church meetings, and PTA conferences, but if our youth, months and years later, still feel unsafe and have crumbling classroom floors and ripped up textbooks - then nothing speaks louder than that. Nothing Communities and public servants are just as important. We cannot support systems and businesses that bring in violence, crime, and drugs, especially ICE. Our youth is sacred and innocent and youth congress is ready to partner with you, there presentatives, to fight the good fight. You probably have heard that we, the young, are visual learners. Please keep in mind that youth watch the way adults behave, how you make decisions, and the way you lead. So let us see more good things for our youth to emulate. As youth Congress Senators, we will work vigorously to identify and address every issue possible. You'll be hearing a lot from this youth congress. This not going to be a do nothing congress. This will be a working congress. In order to be more accessible, the plans of creating Twitter, Face book, Instagram, and YouTube are already in place. On these pages you can find the activities of this youth congress and monthly statements from the respective school representatives. And, in addition to this, a state of the commonwealth from a youth perspective will also be delivered. My fellow senators and I are ready to stand up, speak out AND champion every obstacle. This is my passion, my mission, and this is personal. Because the opportunities available to one child here are vastly different than what a child is given in another island, or even another village down the road. This is a moral obligation - our islands will be judged by our commitment to our next generation. By that measure, can we truly say that as an island community, we are doing enough? We ought to be able to. Thank you.
